Gill St. Bernard's School's Middle School Summer Reading 2013

The purpose of summer reading at Gill St. Bernard's is to help promote a reading habit in our students. It is clear from the research that students who have developed an active reading habit do better on standardized tests including the SATs. It is also clear that students who learn to enjoy reading and do it on a regular basis are better prepared for the academic tasks they face day to day in school.

At each grade level, there are specific books that must be read prior to the start of the school year. While there are no written assignments to be completed during the summer, all grade levels will engage in various class activities and written assignments related to the required books during the opening month of school. In addition, students are expected to take the AR tests for all required and free choice books prior to the first day of school.

PLEASE NOTE: If a student has recently read any of the required readings, they must review the book before the start of school. All students must be prepared to participate in class activities and written assignments!

Entering 5th grade:

- 1. Read the required book *Hatchet* by Gary Paulsen
- 2. Read a minimum of **two additional books**, which should be chosen from the suggested reading list below.
- 3. Keep a list of books read using the attached form.

Entering 6th grade:

- 1. Read the required book *The Giver* by Lois Lowry.
- 2. Read a minimum of **two additional books** which should be chosen from the suggested reading list below.
- 3. Keep a list of books read using the attached form.

Entering 7th grade:

- 1. Read the required books *The Five People You Meet in Heaven* by Mitch Albom.
- 2. Read a minimum of **two additional books** which should be chosen from the suggested reading list below.
- 3. Keep a list of books read using the attached form.

Entering 8th grade:

- 1. Read the required books A Separate Peace by John Knowles
- 2. Read a minimum of **two additional books**, which should be chosen from the suggested reading list below.
- 3. Keep a list of books read using the attached form.
